(2.14) GSAN Elections:

- Each person should write up a short exit report for whoever takes on this role next informative summary of what you have done, suggestions, etc.
 - o Neelima will share a template for this soon
 - Use information from the Google calendar to fill in your exit report to remember details about events you have hosted, etc.
- Online voting for executive elections?
 - Some people seem to prefer online voting especially if their labs are far
 - People are interesting in the general assemblies but not everyone can come to the MNI
 - We actually do have access to SimplyVoting (online voting system) through PGSS – they would set this up for us
 - o BUT to change the voting procedure, we would need a constitutional amendment which will have to be voted on at the next meeting so we cannot change the procedure this year, but we can propose it for next year at the next general assembly to see what people think then pass this information on to the next executive team
- There will likely be an info session in May about the executive positions open to anyone
- For next year's committee, rebrand the position of "Institute Rep" to sound more serious with a greater time commitment to ensure that reps understand the role
